Foolishness of the Cross



For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

1 Corinthians 1:18

If you haven't already noticed, Easter Sunday falls on April 1st this year. Having Easter and April Fool's on the same day on the calendar is more than just interesting ... it actually makes theological sense. St Paul in his First Letter to the Corinthians says, "We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honor, but we in disrepute." (4:10)

Paul is not being literal here, but ironic (read how thick Paul lays it on in this whole passage in 1 Corinthians 4:7-21). The first-century Corinthians had fallen into prideful thinking and were boasting about their own spiritual accomplishments. They began to look down upon Paul, who had founded their Church, probably because his life was so full of hardship and sacrifice. Paul is saying that the joke is on them: that his "foolishness" of suffering for the sake of Christ is actually a mark of God's wisdom. The message of the cross makes all who believe fools for Christ!

Having Easter on April Fool's Day also reminds me of the quick one the disciple Thomas thought his fellow disciples were pulling on him. Thomas wasn't there with his fellow disciples when Jesus appeared to them that

first Easter evening. When they told him, "We have seen the Lord!" Thomas replies, "Unless I see in His hand the imprint of the nails, and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hands into His side, I will not believe." He demands visible, tangible proof before he'll believe. And for Thomas, seeing is believing.



There's only one problem: believing is not seeing. To believe is to confess that God is where God seems not to be, to confess that God is good when God seems to be bad, to confess that what is really real is the God hiding behind the exact opposite of what you see. That is faith. I am so thankful that Jesus doesn't abandon Thomas to drown in a sea of doubt. He doesn't laugh at Thomas' expense. Rather Jesus stretches out His nail-scarred hands and pulls him in. And so He does for you.

Jesus takes your doubts and your fears and your shame and your bitterness and He makes them His own. And He takes His faith and His hope and His life and His joy and His glory and He makes them your own.

He doesn't remove your outward troubles; He gives you

something better: inward peace and true life. He may leave in place your dysfunctional family, your disease, your addiction, your pain, but He will not leave in place a heart empty of peace.

Along with Thomas, we know these things to be no joke: the mercy of the Father, who never denies His baptized children; the love of Christ given and shed for you in body and blood; and the grace of the Holy Spirit, who gives you the peace that passes all understanding.

God bless your Lenten journey this month of March and may the foolishness of the cross fill you with peace and hope.

Prayer is a big, beautiful thing. It is simple and complicated and mysterious all at the same time – but it is essential to our faith life! Martin Luther once said, "To be Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing." This is why I like to focus on prayer during Sunday school, preschool chapel, and King's Kids' devotions. Our children's ministry program isn't about producing "good kids" with a memorized list of morality "do's" and "don'ts." It's more than memorizing Scripture and learning Bible stories (though of course, those are essential parts!) I am more focused on and passionate about our children *developing a living, growing faith relationship with Jesus*. After all, what good are their actions if Jesus is not the Lord of their life? In order for them to become lifelong disciples, our job is to help them encounter Jesus, see their place in His mission, and develop faith skills - and prayer is part of that! In fact, prayer is one of the 4 Faith Skills that we highlight in our Sunday School curriculum.

LISTEN TO GOD'S WORDS

When we read the Bible, and listen to what God has to tell us through His Word, we learn we can trust God no matter what.

DIALOGUE WITH GOD

Through prayer we connect with God. We show gratitude, say we're sorry, and express our feelings to God.

ARTICULATE YOUR FAITH

When we talk about our faith, we learn more about God and can tell others about Jesus.

WORSHIP WITH YOUR LIFE

Worshipping God is more than just singing songs. Worship is about living life in a way that honors God.

During the first half of the year during our Sunday school openings, I focused on sharing the good news truths about prayer! On any given day you could hear me repeating things like, "God loves to hear your prayers! He is always listening to us! It doesn't matter *where* we pray or *how* we pray or the *words* we say! We can talk right to God, and He always hears us!" The Sunday school teachers and I modeled prayer weekly. Then after Christmas, I began to ask brave kiddos to pray in front of our whole group during the opening. I'm still surprised at how many little hands shoot up to volunteer each week! I'm not sure at what age most children decide that it's too scary to pray in front of a group, but I hope these young ones will continue to practice this Faith Skill for years to come. It's been a joy to hear sweet little prayers from their hearts! However, all of you who have spent any amount of time with children will agree that THEY can teach us just as much as WE can teach them. So here are a few things that our children have taught me about prayer as I've had the pleasure of being led by them. Perhaps you, too, can use these lessons in your own prayer life.

- 1. **Just come out with it.** Kids don't put on airs, they're not worried about sounding "churchy" or "holy." May be the best prayers are those that are honest, from the heart and in plain language.
- 2. **Don't be afraid to ask God for things, and don't give up easily.** Have you ever met a child who is shy about asking for something they need or want? "And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to His will He hears us." 1 John 5:14
- 3. **Nothing is too small to talk to God about.** "God, help my boo-boo to feel better." "Thank you for my new shoes." "God thank you for Batman."
- 4. **Review your day**. Often times a child's prayer is just talking about their day! "Dear God, today we played at Nana's house. I ate chicken nuggets and it was rainy." So it's not exactly Luther's Morning Prayer, but I'd be willing to bet that it delights our God just the same!




Ministry Spotlight


Sunday, April 29: Kent State University Treble Chorus



One Sunday after church ended, a choir member came up to me and said, "Now that you are retired, you should join the choir. Practice starts next week." Well, I had no excuses. I have rekindled some older friendships and made some new friends. And it's such a great way to worship and praise God!

A few weeks later, God gave me another nudge. The choir had sung in the early service and was going to sing again at late service. Between services I was standing alone by my mailbox contemplating whether or not I should volunteer to be on the board, another item on my list of promises to God, when in walks the board president, Tim Richard.
