Anxiety is defined as a feeling of worry, nervousness, or unease, typically about an imminent event or something with an uncertain outcome. The medical definition of anxiety is: a multisystem response to a perceived threat or danger. It reflects a combination of biochemical changes in the body, the patient's personal history and memory, and the social situation. Anxiety thrives in uncertainty!

On Sundays mornings starting on September 13, we will be looking at a simple formula the apostle Paul gives us for dealing with anxiety. I say simple because it is easy to learn; but these faith principles can be hard to put into practice. Paul encourages Christians to deal with anxiety with these words:

⁴ Reioice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! 5 Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. ⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. 8 Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. 9 Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

Philippians 4:4-9

God's words guides us to the proper perspective as we face our anxiety. And perspective is the key! Turn your attention away from the problem, and for a few minutes every day, look to God. It does you no good to obsess yourself with your trouble. The more you stare at it, the bigger it grows. Yet the more you look to God, the quicker the problem is reduced to its proper size.



Is God sovereign over your circumstances? Is he mightier than your problem? Does he have answers to your questions? Does God provide forgiveness, life and salvation beyond what we ask for or imagine?

According to the Bible the answer is yes, yes, and yes! So we can approach the throne of grace with confidence. List your concerns and leave them with God. Let him take charge. Let God do what he is so willing to do: give you peace that passes understanding and God will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:7).

I am praying that as we journey together as the body of Christ, the Lord will C.A.L.M. our anxiety and fill us with His peace!



The Board of Directors would like to share with you some of the things that are taking place at TLC. First of all, it has been a long spring/summer for everyone as we make decisions only to have to change them at the last moment.

As you know, Katie Bungard resigned to take a position as a pre-school director elsewhere. After meeting with various candidates, Laura Miller was hired as our Pre-school Director and Patti Trettel was hired to be our Kings Kids Director. Laura presented to the Board her plans to use rooms 6 & 7 for pre-school. The youth would be in the old pre-school room. This would put keep all the kids (pre-school and Kings Kids) in the education wing where they would be more secure. Parents will drop off/pick up kids in the back instead of the doors by the old pre-school that everyone uses for Bible studies etc. The Board agreed to her plan. The switch was made on August 9. On August 16 the youth used their new room for the first time.



Proceeds go towards the pavilion or Agape fund. Your continued support in this program is greatly appreciated.


