Last week in Texas, millions of people experienced the coldest three-day stretch ever on record as they lost their power and the ability to heat their homes. The frigid temperatures caused pipes to burst, leading to water disruptions for roughly half the state's population. Officials also announced food shortages, further complicating the dire situation for Texans.

I have family friends who had frozen pipes burst in their attic leading to water damage throughout their home. Members of TLC had family that had to leave their home without heat/water/ electricity to head somewhere safe. Many of you may have friends and family with similar experiences.

As I grow older and live more life, I have reached the conclusion that one things we can count on in life is that **storms will come!** The storms we face can be caused by relationships, work, our personal failures, other people's failures, and by our fallen creation. Living through a storm is never fun. It can be

challenging, difficult, and often requires hard work to put the pieces back together. Sometimes the disruptions we face can shake the foundation of our faith.

During our 40 Day Red Letter Challenge this Lent, we should not be surprised if we experience storms that seek to disrupt us. In one of the main texts for this spiritual growth campaign, Matthew 7:24-27, Jesus told his hearers to not only hear His words, but to put them into practice. Jesus says that when we hear His words and put them into practice, we will be like a "wise man who built his house on the rock."


Notice that the wise man builds on a rock. In the Old Testament, God is described as the Rock of His people (Psalm 18:1-3). Later, Peter's confession that Jesus is the Christ is called the rock upon which the Church is built (Matthew 16:13-20). In Luke's version of this teaching (Luke 6:46-49), he includes a few more details: the wise man digs down deep to lay a good foundation. This wise person is the person who comes to Jesus, hears His commands, and obeys them. Don't miss this: hearing isn't enough. James writes in James 2 that faith without works is dead. So our works follow our faith—we come to Jesus, we hear His words, and empowered by the Holy Spirit we obey them in faith.

Why is it so important to build on the rock? 'Cause we know what is coming...STORMS! The rain will fall. The wind will blow. The water will rise up. Storms will come. Jesus invites you and me to build our lives on the foundation of faith—hearing His word and doing His word.

Jesus is speaking here of the last storm, the judgement of God against sin on the Last Day, the Day of the Lord. The question Jesus raises is: On the last day, will your house stand?

The Bible teaches that if we are in Christ, there is no condemnation (Romans 8:1) and that all our sin

was placed on Christ and judged at the cross (Isaiah 53; II Corinthians 5:21). So when the final storm comes, if Jesus is your foundation, He will secure you against destruction. But anyone who is outside of Christ has no such protection from the wrath of God.



Doing the Red Letter Challenge and building your life on faith in Jesus and obedience to His teaching is hard. It's challenging, painful and may seem like loss in the short term.

Though popular preachers and teachers may say otherwise, we don't come to Jesus or call people to Jesus because doing so makes things easier or safer in this life, or more materially prosperous. If that's why you follow Jesus, you're not following Him at all. Your life is built on sand and bare ground.

We come to Jesus and build our lives on Him because we are sinners who have earned every drop of the storm of God's wrath, and Jesus Christ is our only hope of salvation. Though we are by nature children of wrath, enemies of God and rebels against His kingdom, He has graciously made a way to cleanse us of sin and adopt us as His children, by grace through faith in Jesus alone—His death and resurrection securing our justification and hope of a future inheritance.

One of my favorite hymns is *How Firm A* Foundation. I will close my thoughts with the first stanza of this hymn which declares our hope and refuge in our Savior, Jesus Christ.

How firm a foundation, O saints of the Lord, Is laid for your faith in His excellent Word! What more can He say than to you He has said

Who unto the Savior for refuge have fled?


