As I look at the world today, there seems to be so many things that don't make sense happening and I am tempted to wonder, "Where are you God in the midst of all of this? When will you come back? When will you act?" We all go through periods of waiting in our lives, and we need hope to get us through the waiting. Hope is waiting with a certain expectation that the LORD is present in the moment and is working behind the scenes. Hope is holding onto the reality that God is working in all things for the sake of those who love Him. Hope is knowing that God will never leave you nor forsake you.



Waiting is never easy, and whatever you are waiting on today, I want you to know there is hope in Christ. Whether you are

waiting on God's direction or a job offer or an answer to prayer or a response from someone you love – whatever you are waiting for this Advent, there is hope in Christ, and this season of Advent reminds us that hope in Christ will get us through the waiting.

I believe that Advent is an incredible season to grow deeper in faith in Jesus, because Advent prepares us to wait for Jesus. We wait for his birth like the prophets and like Mary. And we wait with believers across the centuries for his return.

Advent offers a stark reminder that God not only walked on earth as a human, but started that journey as an embryo in an unwed teen mom. God's vulnerability to us paved the way for our vulnerability before God as people who walk in faith, day by day.

I recently came across a definition of what the life of a Jesus follower looks like. A disciple of Jesus seeks to give "our everyday 'Yes' to Jesus." That's because in the Gospels, we see Jesus encounter all kinds of people and extend all kinds of invitations, but the most alarming moments are when he looks someone in the eye and offers, "Come, follow me." The stakes are high.

Answering yes changes everything.

An everyday "Yes" to Jesus is a response to God's invitation to enter

a mystery. Advent, Christmas, and the new year offer new opportunities to ask questions like:

What does it mean to you to follow Jesus?

What makes you not want to follow Jesus or be part of the church sometimes?

How would you say your faith impacts your view of yourself? Why do you think Advent is about "waiting" on God? What do you like about that? What's frustrating about that?

The seasons of Advent and Christmas are wonderful for so many reasons, but one of the most important reasons is the hope that Christ brings to a lost world. "Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came



the world to save sinners." (1 Timothy 3:15) That means He came to save you and to save me. Jesus was born into this world at Christmas so that he could grow to be a man and die on the cross for your sins and mine.

So if you are facing any discouragement in your life – if you are tired of waiting, if you feel like giving up, if you've faced too many disappointments in life – then let me point you to Christ and the hope that is found in him alone.

Hope is coming; love is coming. A shining realm of peace and wholeness is, truly, coming.

Advent is a season of longing, of waiting, and of expectation that the transcendent God, the sometimes seemingly far-off God would draw near, come close, and enter into our world. As the late Eugene Peterson adeptly expressed the fulfillment of this longing in his paraphrase of John 1:14, "The Word became flesh and moved into the neighborhood," Advent is the season in the church where we *yearn afresh* for God's intimate presence among us.

Advent is the dawn of the new liturgical year, the sunrise of the church's soul, a new season of promise and renewed hope that God will indeed surprise us with another visit and moreover with a prolonged stay in our territory, a domain occupied by pandemics, pains, perils, and precarious pitfalls, and that God will prevail. Advent harkens to the ancient hope of Israel, to the incarnation of God in the flesh in Jesus, and to the church's hope of his return. It is a season in which we might make the words of Isaiah 64:1 our own: "Oh, that you would rip open the heavens and descend!" We have taken this clarion cry of the prophet Isaiah as our Advent series' theme, "Tear Down the Heavens," expressing the human heart's desire for God's presence.



#### Communion

On Monday night November 1, the Board of Elders approved to decision to begin offering the Lord's Supper at every Sunday morning worship service. TLC began offering the Eucharist (Meal of Thanksgiving) every Sunday during the month of November - the month of Thanksgiving – and will make every Sunday Communion our new practice. There may be rare Sundays where Holy Communion will not be offered (for example Christmas Cantata Sunday) and we will not offer Holy Communion at midweek Advent or Lenten services as these services are more devotional in nature. In the early Christian Church, the preaching of the apostles and the reception of Christ's body and blood went hand and hand. The early church always had sermon and supper together. The Lord's Supper is the climax of the sermon. The two go hand in hand. I believe that the Holy Supper is the Church's heartbeat. Along with the preached Gospel, it is what keeps the Church alive.

#### 2021 Activities:

- \* We partnered with The Akron-Canton Regional Food bank which has filled our cupboards and allowed us to provide 3-4 bags of food per month to each family we serve.
- \* Thrivent Action Grants- purchased cloth bags with our church's logo on them to help distribute food.
- \* Thrivent Action Grant- purchased a new cupboard to help store additional food/dry goods.
- \* Thrivent Choice Dollars- purchased a refrigerator/ freezer to store additional foods for monthly distributions.
- \* We began a partnership with Giant Eagle in Stow, which has allowed us to access day-old breads and desserts that are used for our families and/or given to Good Neighbors in Goodyear Heights.
- \* A core group of volunteers that rotate their time to help pack bags at the end of the month for distribution. Thank you volunteers!
- \* Continued support from the congregation.

All of this allows us to support about 50 people each month (13-15 families). We will also be providing them with a Thanksgiving and a Christmas meal this year.

Food insecurity is REAL and affects people living right in our community!


