Love Matters



Have you heard of the Grant Study? In 1938 a group of researchers from Harvard University set out to answer the question of what habits led to a fulfilling life. They chose a group of 268 men who for the next seventy-five years were studied on a range of psychological, physical, economic, and spiritual characteristics. Called the Grant Study (named after its patron W. T. Grant, the department-store baron), it became the longest-running longitudinal study of human development.

With the remaining participants now reaching into their early nineties, George Vaillant, the last acting director of the Grant Study, decided to bring it to a close by publishing what they had learned in a remarkable book called *Triumphs of Experience*. After more than seventy-five years of research, they learned that while factors such as education, a stable marriage, and healthy lifestyle choices were all helpful for a good life, there was only one thing that really mattered to a vibrant life: **love.** The capacity to love and be loved is the point of our human existence. "The only thing that really matters in life [is] your relations to other people," Vaillant said.


The Apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 13:13

LOVE MATTERS

What would it look like if everyone lived as if love mattered most? What if we oriented our lives around loving others in a sacrificial way? How would our relationships change? How would our workplaces and schools change? How would our society change?

One of the books that Annie and I read before we were married is *Sacred Marriage* by Gary Thomas. This books poses a thoughtful question...What if God designed marriage to make us *HOLY* more than to make us *HAPPY*? Gary Thomas writes,

"Marriage calls us to an entirely new and selfless life. . . . Any situation that calls me to confront my selfishness has enormous spiritual value, and I slowly began to understand that the real purpose of marriage may not be happiness as much as it is holiness. . . . If we view the marriage relationship as an opportunity to excel in love, it doesn't matter how difficult the person is whom we are called to love; it doesn't matter even whether that love is ever returned. We can still excel at love. We can still say, "Like it or not, I'm going to love you like nobody ever has." . . .

Marriage creates a situation in which our



desire to be served and coddled can be replaced with a more noble desire to serve others—even

to sacrifice for others. . . . Each day we must die to our own desires and rise as a servant. Each day we are called to identify with the suffering Christ on the cross, and then be empowered by the resurrected Christ. We die to our expectations, our demands, and our fears. We rise to compromise, service, and courage.

These were challenging ideas for Annie and me. To be honest, most of the time I am more concerned about being happy than holy. It is in relationships that we get to put our faith into practice...loving, forgiving, helping, serving. That's why being part of a church family is so important—bearing with our brothers and sisters in Christ that are different than us allows us to put love into practice! As we come together for worship, Sunday School, and Bible Study, we hear that God loves us...but we also hear that the people around us love us as well.

In the book, *Deeply Loved* by Keri Wyatt Kent, the author tells the story of how two foster parents help their foster child understand the love of God:

Patti and Bruce, feeling a tug from Jesus, welcomed a four-year-old foster child into their home. Originally the child welfare organization told them Jonathan would be staying with them and their four other children for about a month. Five months later, after a couple of attempts to place him back with his mother, he's still living with Patti and Bruce.

The process has been messy and complicated. This little boy is sweet, charming, and winsome at times, but angry and confused at other times. So sometimes he cuddles and hugs, but other times he acts out: yelling, scratching, hitting, and even biting.

My friends have loved this child, even as he tries their patience, even as they sometimes despair over the difficulties his birth family faces: poverty, illness, and so on. When they tuck him in at night, they ask him, "Jonathan, when God looks at you, what does he say?" And they have taught him to answer, "He says, 'I sure do love that little boy!"

It is my hope and prayer at Tallmadge Lutheran Church: that each of us knows, beyond a shadow of a doubt, "God loves me!" I also pray that the Lord uses each of us to let the members of our families, our co-workers and classmates that God loves them too!
