

# Lent 2022 Stand Firm: A Beautiful Resistance

For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. **Ephesians 6:12-13** 

After the arrival of Covid19, the riots of the summer of 2020, the presidential election later that fall, and all the turmoil of this past year, it feels like our nation is more divided than it's been since the Civil War. The culture wars have pivoted to fighting over Critical Race Theory and transgenderism. The Biblical perspectives of the Christian church have frequently been rendered as judgmental and evil. The experience of following Jesus in our cultural moment: it feels like a war for our soul. There is a kind of tug-of-war that is emotionally and spiritually depleting, a tearing at the fabric of our souls' peace.

Why does every day feel like a battle just to stay faithful, to keep following Jesus? Here is an idea: *maybe because it is.*

For centuries, teachers of the Way of Jesus used a paradigm that's been lost in the modern era, that of the "three enemies of the soul:" Martin Luther defined these three enemies of the soul as:



The world.
The flesh.
And the devil.

While the exact phrase the world, the flesh, and the devil isn't used by Jesus or the writers of the New Testament, the language and categories are. The apostle Paul regularly likened following Jesus to a war. One of Paul's most famous sayings is "Fight the good fight of faith." He told the Ephesians to "put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes" and prayed that their pastor Timothy would "fight the battle well." Paul reminds us that "our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but ... against the spiritual forces of evil" and that "the weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world," but he did claim that we have "divine power to demolish strongholds."

While most Christians in the first four centuries after Jesus were pacifists, the idea of spiritual warfare was used to describe the inner dynamics of the soul. The Christian war against the three enemies of the soul is not a war of guns and bombs. It's not against other people at all.

It's a war on lies. And the problem is less that we tell lies and more that we live them. We let false narratives about reality into our bodies, and they wreak havoc in our souls.

This Lent at Tallmadge Lutheran Church, we will be rallying together to **STAND FIRM** in our faith in Jesus Christ. On Sunday mornings, the worship services and sermons will be focused on "Knowing the Enemies of Your Soul." Drawing from John Mark Comer's book *Live No Lies*, we will recognize this three-pronged strategy:

THE DEVIL uses deceptive ideas...
that play into disordered desires of OUR FLESH...
that are normalized in a sinful society of THE
WORLD.

Jesus sees our primary war against the devil as a fight to believe truth over lies. On Sunday mornings, we will ask the Holy Spirit to guide us to the truth – to Jesus. Through Jesus' perfect life, innocent suffering and death, and glorious resurrection, Jesus sets us free. In Christ, we daily die to self and rise in Jesus. The Holy Spirit covers us in the armor of God so that we may be able to stand our ground.

On Wednesday Midweek Lenten services, we will draw strength from the faithful practice of spiritual disciplines. God has gifted His Church with spiritual disciplines by which we mitigate the isolation and lies of the devil in our secular society with the Spirit and Truth of Jesus and His kingdom. We will focus on spiritual resistance through confession, solitude and prayer, meditating on Scripture, fasting, and corporate worship. By practicing spiritual disciplines and holding to the teachings of Jesus, we will resist the temptations of the devil, the flesh and the world while becoming more and more like Jesus Christ.

It is my hope and prayer that this Lent, you may be strengthened in your walk as a follower of Jesus to "fight the good fight of faith"!





Entrances/walkways shoveled and salted as needed by staff during the week.


Olds Pest Control set bait early January for potential varmints in Youth Room attic.
