matter of survival. And so sometimes we compromise and drift as a matter of just getting by.

If we are honest, most of us end up where we never wanted to go! None of us get married thinking, "I hope to drift from madly in love to just tolerating each other," or, "I hope to one day dread your presence." None of us started a relationship with Jesus thinking, "I hope to one day dread going to church." It doesn't make sense! Yet, it happens constantly. We give in, we give up, we drift.

Perhaps you are wondering: What are some signs that perhaps you are drifting away?

- Do you find that sinning is easier than it once was?
- Is your conscience and the work of the Spirit not guiding you into truth like they once were?
- Are your Bible reading, prayer, and sermons affecting you more or less than they once did?
- Are you sluggish spiritually or excited spiritually?

If you find yourself answering yes to any of these, you may be drifting away from your first love of Jesus Christ. Jesus challenges the church of Ephesus in Revelation 2:

But I have this against you, that you have abandoned your FIRST LOVE. Remember therefore from where you have fallen; REPENT AND DO THE WORKS YOU DID AT FIRST. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent.

As we drift, first turn is to plead with God to grant you repentance. Turn away from those things that had taken your gaze off of Christ. Study and pray about the cross and the sacrifice and the glory of Christ. Remember the things that used to take place when your gaze was fixed on Christ. Drifting is the result of neglecting the great salvation worked by our great Savior.

In this New Year of 2023, the question I would like to put before you is this: How do we not just return, how do we advance, grow, and move forward as followers of Jesus Christ?

Starting on January 8. we will begin to talk about how to recalibrate and advance to what matters. As a people of God, we will talk about how to maintain that course so that we can develop tools and strategies so that we don't drift as much off course again. Drifting happens, but it doesn't have to happen as much and we can even learn from our drifting experiences to enhance our faith.

Start this New Year with a commitment to fight against DRIFT by attending church for this four-week sermon series:

- January 8, 2023 From Under God to Over God
- January 15, 2023 From Forward to Familiar
- January 22, 2023 From Transformation to Information
- January 29, 2023 From Thanking to Comparing

The Apostle Paul had a laser focus toward finishing strong for the Lord. He wrote, "I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus." (Acts 20:24) Paul wanted to keep his eyes on the prize of finishing well for the Lord.

My prayer for all the saints at TLC is that together, we may run the good race and finish the course keeping our eyes fixed of Jesus.
