THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHNNY CASH: YOU ARE NEVER TOO FAR GONE

Last summer, I was looking for something to watch and I came across the movie "I Walk the Line." This movie chronicled the life of country music legend Johnny Cash, from his early days on an Arkansas cotton farm to his rise to fame with Sun Records in Memphis. Joaquin Phoenix played the role of Johnny Cash and Reese Witherspoon played June Carter. Before watching this movie, I was familiar with some of Johnny Cash's music, but I didn't know much about his life.

In real life, Johnny Cash was far from perfect. He acknowledged that he was a sinner. His struggle with addiction is well known, and it was a lifelong struggle. His first marriage ended in divorce. The death of his brother in childhood left a mark of trauma that affected his life. His less-than-ideal image is part of what has made his legacy enduring; he made outlaw country a thing.

Johnny Cash was also a Christian, a saint washed clean through faith in Jesus Christ. Cash expressed his faith in his music, by writing multiple books on Christianity, and he made movies about what his faith meant to him. Johnny Cash, despite is outlaw image did want to share the gospel widely in his way.



Saints and sinners, all jumbled up together. That's the genius of Johnny Cash, and that's what the gospel is ultimately all about. Jesus came to save sinners and most of his ministry occurred at the margins. Johnny Cash sang about and for people on the margins. He famously played concerts in prisons, where he sang both murder ballads and gospel tunes in the same set. It's this juxtaposition between light and dark that makes Cash one of the most authentic theologians in memory.



In Richard Beck's book, *Trains, Jesus, and Murder: The Gospel According the Johnny Cash*, he writes that the gospel according to the Man in Black is this: "drawing near to and loving the lost, unnoticed, unremarkable, excluded, powerless, broken, condemned, and despicable. Solidarity is a love that grows warmest in the coldest places. That vision prompts us to take the second step in the dance of divine solidarity. After we read the world to locate God among the victims and the oppressed, we are called to action, to move ourselves to stand with those who are suffering. As Bonheoffer said, God "goes right into the middle of it." God draws near."

Beck also writes, "God is found in Jesus among the cursed and godforsaken. Again, the first place to look for Jesus is in hell. By standing with the poor and beaten down, the music of Johnny Cash shows us how a gospel of solidarity begins as an interpretative activity: the cross is a way of seeing and reading the world. Specifically, the cross helps us answer this most important question: Where is God?"

Starting on April 16, the Sunday after Easter, come experience The Gospel According the Johnny Cash: No One is Too Far Gone in our worship services. Pastor Andy will share messages of hope and redemption through scripture and Johnny Cash songs. If you have a friend who enjoys Johnny Cash, be sure to invite them for this sermon series!

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Adopted Through Christ

Adoption is an amazing thing. In the Bible, we are told that we are adopted as sons through Jesus, and for me, this paints a wonderful picture of God's love. My sister Laura was adopted. As a baby, she lived in an orphanage in Russia. When she was eight months old, my parents traveled across the world and brought her home as their child. She was loved and raised no different from any of her siblings. She was family.

My mother then changed her career path to do adoption work for other families. She worked on both international and domestic adoptions and loved talking about her job. I got to hear story after story of families bringing in children and loving them as their own. These kids got the hope of a new life with loving parents.

It is through my sister's and my mother's stories that I began to understand the fullness of God's love. In Galatians 4:4-7, Paul writes "but when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying 'Abba! Father!' So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God." God sent Jesus to die on the cross so that we may be redeemed. And, through Christ, we are children of God. This is a gift and a chance to have a new life with the Father. We have a fresh start because of the grace of God. And, because we are children of God, we receive the Spirit into our hearts and are heirs to his promises. This adoption is an act of pure love; he doesn't revoke it because we mess up. Just like all the stories of adoptions I grew up hearing, God chose us and brought us in, loving us as his own. So, even though we don't deserve it, we can count on and turn to our loving Father because He has made us his children through Christ.


