# God is in Control



Do you ever look at the things that happen in your life and the things that are going on in the world around us and feel like everything is out of control? Questions arise. Why do things happen the way they do? Why do bad things happen to good people? Is everything just spinning out of control? Regardless how chaotic things

may appear in the world or in your life understand that God is on His throne and God is in control. The Holy Spirit is at move in this world expanding the Kingdom of Christ and ordering events according to God's gracious will.

This month of November, I want to remind you all that all things are under God's control. Throughout Scripture, God represents Himself as the absolute ruler of His created universe. God is in absolute control of all things, the world we live in, all nature, all governments, as well as your life and mine. As we have been studying the book of Daniel the past few months, one of the truths from God's Word that has struck me again and again is this: in spite of present appearances, God is in control. God really is king and in charge and His kingdom is the one that lasts.

It's remarkable to me that more than 150 years before Cyrus—who would become the ruler of Persia and the Medes—was born, Isaiah prophesied *(Isaiah 45:1-3)* that the Lord would use Cyrus to free the Israelites from their Babylonian captivity. In this remarkable prophecy God speaks of holding Cyrus's hand enabling him to subdue many nations including the Syrians, Assyrians, Arabians, Cappadocians, Phrygians, the Lydians, Carians, Phoenicians, the Bactrians, Indians and Babylonians. The ancient Greek historian Herodotus said that Cyrus vanquished whatsoever country he invaded.

As we consider the presidential election at hand, Romans 13 verse 1 is a great verse to remember: "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God." The point is that God is in control of all history. History is no more than "His Story."



Ultimately what is God seeking to work and will in this world? God's purpose is two-fold: 1) To bring glory to His name - "... they may know from the rising of the sun to its setting That there is none besides Me. I am the Lord, and there is no other;" and 2) To preserve a people for His glory - "For Jacob My servant's sake, and Israel My elect, I have even called you by your name..."

One of the great promises the Lord gives us is found in **Romans 8:28-30**:

"And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified."



However messy things look on the outside, God is at work behind the scenes in our lives to accomplish His eternal purpose. And He will accomplish it, for His own glory. It is important to note that the scriptures teach all things "work together *for* good" not that all things *are* good; and that they "work together for good to those who love God" - for those who are saved who have been called and have accept Christ as Lord.

We often try to figure out the "*whys*?" and want to understand the things that happen in the world. I've heard it said, "The Bible never once says 'Figure it out,' but over and over it says 'Trust God'. He's already got it all figured out!" If you know Christ the writers of the New Testament assure us that our Father does indeed have everything under control in our lives. One of the marks of spiritual; maturity is the quiet confidence that God is in control without the need to understand why He does what He does. Because God is in control we need to simply trust Him.

### 1 Thessalonians 5:24

"He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it."

Because God is in control we need to let go and let God. Letting go is admitting that we are really not in control and allowing God to control our lives. We need to let go of our own will and submit to the will of God. Letting go also means giving glory to God for everything that transpires in our lives.

### 1 Thessalonians 5:18

"In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

God has got this! Trusting in Jesus and giving thanks in all things with you,
