

"Do Not Be Afraid!"

What are you afraid of? We call fear by many names. We call it worry, tension, anxiety, and stress. One study looked at 500 different people and discovered 7,000 different fears – an average of 14 different fears per person! Being afraid is not some minor issue; dealing with fear is absolutely critical.


Why? Fear is contagious. Fear is limiting. It's draining. Fear is the dark room where negativity develops.

This is why the life, death and resurrection of Jesus is so important for you and for me. Do you remember what the first words the angels said after Jesus rose from the dead? "Do not be afraid!" What were the first words Jesus said after he rose from the dead? "Do not be afraid!" What were the first words the disciples heard Jesus say when he met them as a group? "Don't be afraid!" That's the message of Easter.

And, most importantly, God doesn't want you to be afraid. Ephesians 3:12 says, "In Christ we can come before God with freedom and without fear. We can do this through faith in Christ."



When you wrestle with fears, keep these Easter realities to heart:

In Jesus' death and resurrection, God shows his perfect love for you. Our deepest need in life is to feel absolutely, totally, unconditionally loved --- not for something we could be or should be - but loved just as we are. Only God can love



us with as much love as we really need. God created us in His image so that we can live in love relationship with Him. God knows everything about us. And he wants us to know him and love him back. That's why God sent Jesus Christ to live a perfect life, to die on the cross for us to pay for our sins, and to rise again defeating death. That's what Easter is all about. When this truth sinks in our hearts, the words of 1 John 4:18 come to pass: "Where God's love is, there is no fear because God's perfect love drives out fear."



Commit your fears and your life to Jesus! Part of the reason so many people are so scared today is that we've placed our trust in the wrong places. At times, we have placed our trust in money, in our possessions, and in our natural abilities to solve our problems. When we place our trust in anything other than the Lord, in reality, that's idolatry. Anytime we let this happen, we are making something else into a god. And when something of this world becomes more important than God, fear is sure to come. If making money is the number one goal in a person's life, he or she will develop a fear of losing it all. If success is the most important thing, a fear of failure will develop. If you take a moment to consider what scares

you them, there's a good chance you can discover what is competing with God in your life.

1 Peter 3:14-15 says, "Do not fear what they fear; do not be frightened. But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord." The only real antidote to the fear is a commitment to Christ. When you continue to make Jesus Lord of your life, you don't have to fear losing anything – nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus! When we fully rely on God, our fears are replaced by *PEACE*.



May your hearts and lives be filled with Easter HOPE and JOY and PEACE trusting that God loves you so much that He sent his only Son to die for you on the cross. May God's perfect love drive out all fear!



The Lutheran Women's Missionary League will be having their Spring Rally on April 26.



Marriage Connect Group


We've just completed our study on Cherish! With April being a busy month and Easter around the corner, we will not be meeting for our group in April. But get ready for an exciting event in May!



Samaritan's Feet serves and inspires hope in children by providing shoes as the foundation to a spiritual and healthy life resulting in the advancement of education and economic opportunities. Their vision is a world with zero shoeless children.

Samaritan's Feet: How We Help

Samaritan's Feet believes that a pair of shoes and foot-washing can provide a tangible foundation of hope and the opportunity for a better life, prompting children to focus on school and families not to worry and protect feet to decrease the possibility of getting a foot-borne disease.

Why Donate Old Sneakers?

Most people throw away their used sneakers every 125-200 days without ever thinking of recycling them. Donating sneakers helps you clean out your closet, protect the environment, and support a non-profit. It may be time to donate your sneakers when you still have in your closet, but you just got new ones or simply have a pile you do not wear anymore. When you donate sneakers, you help create a sustainable program.

What Should You Do with Old Sneakers?

Whether your shoes are no longer reusable, or you simply do not want them anymore, there are several options for getting rid of unwanted sneakers.

Recycle: When Your Sneakers Might Not be Reusable

Unfortunately, there are shoes that are not eligible for donation. Not all sneakers can get reused as-is, as some are just too worn down. However, you can still recycle your sneakers when the textile components of your old footwear can be used to make something else. For example, heavily used footwear is recycled to reuse materials or convert to new energy sources.

Donate: When Your Sneakers are Still Wearable

If the shoes are still wearable, a great way to repurpose them is to give them to someone else who will wear them. By donating your shoes, you are providing hope and an opportunity for a better life to those in need. There are many organizations where you can donate your sneakers, both locally and internationally, including Samaritan's Feet. The simplest advice is to donate used sneakers.

Donation of new or like new sneakers are also welcome. Please place these in in a separate bag when donating. All sizes are welcome.



Please find a box in the Library marked *Samaritan's Feet* for the purpose of collection your new (or like new...place these shoes in a separate bag), used and worn-out sneakers to be used by others for the mission of Samaritans Feet. New and used sneakers (wearable) will go directly to those in need. Worn out sneakers will be recycled with funds going back to the ministry. 
