### Staying Rooted in the Word

- Summer Service Opportunities: Look for ways to serve during the summer months. Whether it's helping with Vacation Bible School, participating in a mission project, or simply reaching out to fellow members who might be lonely, summer service keeps us connected to our calling as the body of Christ.

Examples of the desired items include hairbrushes, combs, water bottles, washcloths, nail clippers, fun bandages, sets of eating utensils, etc.



# **Tuesday Prayer Group**






last a lifetime.




