

#### What's a Christian, Anyway?

In our age of endless hot takes and social media arguments, many Christians find themselves asking a fundamental question: "What's a Christian, anyway?" We live in a world where popularity has replaced credibility, where everyone is an expert, and where even fellow

believers seem to be arguing about everything from theology to politics to lifestyle choices.

The church has been here before. In the early centuries of Christianity, communities were growing rapidly with insufficient accountability, competing interpretations of the faith were emerging, and believers needed guidance to distinguish authentic Christianity from dangerous counterfeits. Our spiritual ancestors crafted a powerful resource to help them find their way: **The Nicene Creed**.

Pastor and theologian Glenn Packiam reminds us that farmers in prairie days would tie a rope from the house to the barn when a blizzard was coming so they wouldn't get lost in the whiteout conditions. The Nicene Creed serves as our rope—not just a statement of beliefs, but a lifeline to lead us home to the heart of authentic Christianity.

Written in AD 325 at the Council of Nicaea and refined in AD 381, this ancient confession has stood the test of time. It's the only confession affirmed by every major stream of Christianity—Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant alike. It's both inclusive enough to unite us as believers and sharp enough to distinguish Christian faith from counterfeits.

**Together we confess "I Believe In..."** We confess the Nicene Creed together as a family of faith. Even though the church is made of individuals, our common faith unites us. The power of community faith means we don't have to carry the weight of belief on our own—we carry it together.

"I believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth..." This confession reminds us that God is the source of every good gift, the author of our story, and sufficient for all our needs. We don't have to write our own stories or manufacture our own hope.

"I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ..." The longest section of the Creed focuses on Jesus—the eternal Son who became incarnate "for us and for our salvation." He is both our saving King and the eternal Son of God who came down to the very bottom of human experience to rescue us.

"I believe in the Holy Spirit..." The Spirit is not a force or feeling, but the Lord and giver of life who calls us by the Gospel, enlightens us with His gifts, makes us holy through faith and then empowers us to share the love of Jesus Christ to all the world.



#### The Story We Enter

The Creed tells a sweeping story: from the Creator of all things visible and invisible, to the Redeemer who died and rose again, to the Spirit who gives life to the church, to the ultimate hope of resurrection and the life of the world to come.

the TRIUNE GOD This isn't just ancient history—it's the story we enter when we confess together "I believe." As the Creed reminds us, we belong to "one holy catholic and apostolic Church." We acknowledge "one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins" and look forward to "the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come."

#### **Living the Creed Today**

How do we live as people who believe this story?

- Stay in the boat: Lean into Christian community rather than trying to navigate faith alone
- Move beyond knowing about Jesus to knowing Jesus: Faith requires humility and surrender to mystery
- Remember our baptism: We are both one and holy in Christ—realities we must live into
- Put up our sails: Surrender areas of our lives to the Holy Spirit's leading

Live now as it will be then: Proclaim the Good News, pray for the sick, work for justice, and love like Jesus Missionary theologian Leslie Newbigin once asked how the strange story of God made flesh could become credible to a world conditioned to believe only what can be explained without God. His answer: "I know of only one clue... only one hermeneutic of the gospel: a congregation which believes it."

Pastor Andy will begin a 7-week sermon series on The Nicene Creed starting on Sunday, October 5. The world yearns for Christ's joy, peace, and hope, but the gospel is only believable if Christians live like it's true. The Nicene Creed isn't just a statement we recite—it's a story we embody, a hope we carry, and a vision of what it means to be Christian.

Cost is \$495.00 per participant (Option: 10 payments of \$49.50) Grants available from TLC!


#### 5. Our Heart.

This book is lengthy, so we will take two months to read and discuss this book.


