## Blessed Be the Name of the Lord

*What the Book of Job Teaches Us About Faith, Suffering, and Grace*

The name “Job” itself comes from a word meaning enemy. At his lowest moments, Job announced that God had become his enemy—and that God was treating him as one. In that raw, anguished cry, Job becomes the representative of every believer who has ever sat in the darkness of suffering and wondered whether God is still for them. If you have ever been there, the Book of Job is written for you.

This Lent we are working our way through this extraordinary book. I want to share some of its most important teachings with you here, because Job offers far more than a story about a man who suffered and recovered. It speaks to the very heart of what it means to be a Christian—why we serve God, what faith really looks like under pressure, and how to walk alongside those who are hurting.

## The Real Question in Job

Most people assume the Book of Job is about theodicy—the question of why a good and powerful God allows innocent people to suffer. That is certainly a theme woven through the book. But the driving question God himself raises in the opening chapters is something altogether different: Do people serve God because of what they get from him, or out of loving gratitude for what he has already done?

In the heavenly prologue, the accuser (Satan) makes a cynical wager: take away Job’s blessings and he will curse God to his face. Every man has his price, Satan insists. Job only loves God because God has been good to him. God accepts the challenge, confident that Job’s faith is genuine—not a transaction, but a relationship rooted in grace.



This is the question that confronts each of us: Is our faith a vending machine relationship, where we put in good behavior and expect blessings in return? Or is it a living trust in the God who loves us freely and unconditionally? The Bible answers that question by pointing us to Jesus who has suffered for our sins on the cross. Jesus entered into our humanity and suffered for us!

## The Danger of False Faith

Job’s three friends—Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar—arrive in the opening chapters as models of compassion. They travel to be with him, they weep, they sit with him in silence for seven days and seven nights. They begin well. But then they begin to talk, and everything unravels.

Their theology is built on a mechanical view of retribution: the righteous always prosper and the wicked always suffer. Therefore, since Job is suffering, he must have sinned. Their counsel to him is simple—stop claiming innocence and repent. What they cannot accept is a righteous sufferer. Their faith has no room for a God who justifies sinners by grace.

This is a sobering mirror for all of us. How often do we, even unconsciously, operate with the same assumptions? When things go well, we feel we must be doing something right. When someone endures prolonged suffering or hardship, we quietly wonder what they did to deserve it. The friends’ error was not a lack of compassion—it was a lack of the Gospel. They knew the Law, but they did not know grace.

## Job’s Remarkable Faith



Job’s faith is not serene or tidy. He rages. He laments. He accuses God of injustice. He curses the day of his birth. And yet, scattered like gold through the dark ore of his anguish, there are some of the most breathtaking confessions of faith in all of Scripture.

In Job 13:15 he declares, “Though he slay me, yet will I trust in him.” In Job 19:25–27 he confesses a living Redeemer who will stand upon the earth, and that with his own eyes he will see God—an extraordinary anticipation of the resurrection. Job longs for a Mediator, someone who can stand between him and God, plead his case, and bring reconciliation.

This, of course, is precisely what we have in Jesus Christ. Job’s Redeemer lives. He has stood upon the earth. He has taken our case before the Father, bearing the full weight of judgment so that we might stand before God not on the basis of our own righteousness, but on the basis of his. The Book of Job points us straight to the cross and the empty tomb.

## God's Answer from the Whirlwind

When God finally speaks in Job 38–41, He does not explain Job's suffering. He does not answer the theodicy question. Instead, he opens the entire universe before Job's eyes—the foundations of the earth, the gates of death, the storehouses of snow and hail, the morning stars, the young lions hunting their prey. The effect is not to humiliate Job, but to expand his vision beyond his own pain.

In Job 3, he was curved inward, consumed by his own suffering. In the Yahweh speeches, God opens his horizons wide and invites him to look outward toward life and upward toward heaven. The God who governs the cosmos with such meticulous care is the same God who governs every human life—including yours, including mine—according to his own lofty purposes of grace, justice, and eternal salvation.

I hope you will join us on Lenten Midweek worship services on Wednesday nights and my Sunday morning Bible Study in Room 12 as we continue exploring this magnificent and challenging book together. Whatever suffering or doubt you may be carrying right now, the Book of Job was written for you—and it points you to the living Redeemer who suffered and died on the cross for you and gloriously rose from the dead.

Each Thursday we will watch one episode starting at 6:30pm in the Sanctuary.

## Thursday, February 5, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 1 – Entry**      *John 16:16-33; 17:1-4; Ps. 118:19-23*

Jesus rides into the Holy City as King, but finds that the rulers have turned His Father's House from a place of prayer to a corrupt market.

## Thursday, February 12, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 2 – House of Cards**      *Matt. 26:31-35; Luke 22:31-34; Matt. 26:35; John 15:13; Mark 11:15-19*

Why kill Jesus when Rome can do it for you? As the Jewish High Priest schemes to bring Him down, Jesus strikes first: turning the tables.

## Thursday, February 19, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 3 – Woes**      *John 13:36b; 14:1-29; 13:37-38a; Matt. 21:23-46; Psalm 5*

Jesus preaches one last time to the massive Passover crowd, and the religious leaders try to trap Him in His words.

## Thursday, February 26, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 4 – The Same Coin**      *John 13:18-30, 33-36a; Matt. 21:18-22*

Afraid of public outcry—and further embarrassment— Caiaphas resolves to arrest Jesus quietly at night. Only one problem: no one knows how to find Him.

## Thursday, March 5, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 5 – Because of Me**      *Matt. 26:22; John 13:23-24; Luke 22:23-30; Mark 11:12-25*

The decision to arrest Jesus leads to a fiery debate. Roman soldiers track down a troublemaking crowd. Shmuel finds help from an unexpected source.

## Thursday, March 12, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 6 - Reunions**      *Matthew 26:20-30; John 15:1-17*

As Jesus’ followers gather for the Passover meal, His enemies assemble for a man hunt. Judas holds a secret meeting.

## Thursday, March 19, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 7 - The Upper Room: Part 1**      *John 13:1-17; Isa. 52:7*

Jesus and the disciples celebrate Hanukkah. Matthew confronts Judas about irregularities, and the festival turns into a fight, then flight. The disciples escape with their lives, but learn a friend hasn’t been so lucky.

## Thursday, March 26, 6:30 pm – 7:45 pm

**EPISODE 8 - The Upper Room: Part 2**      *Matthew 26:17-56; Ezek. 37:1-14*

Pilate summons Atticus to read him the riot act. The Sanhedrin boils over. The Last Supper ends.

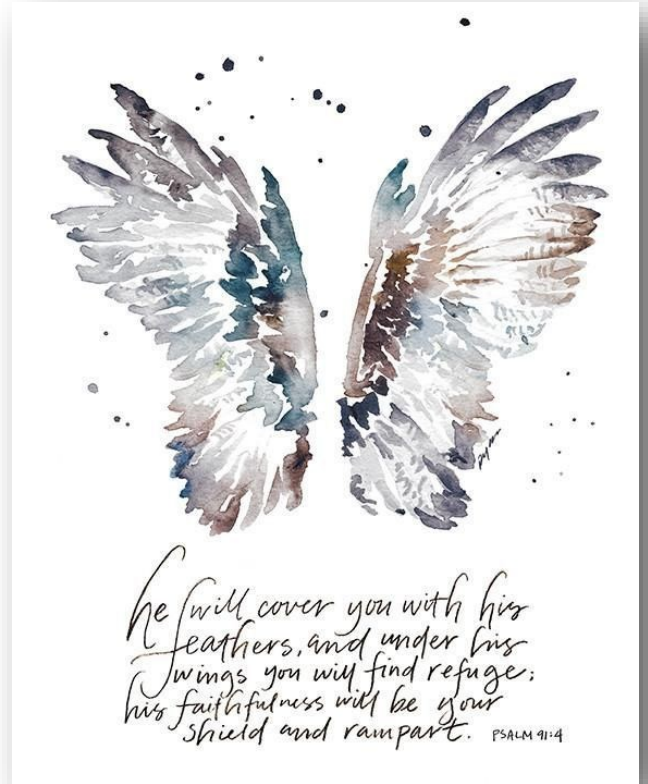

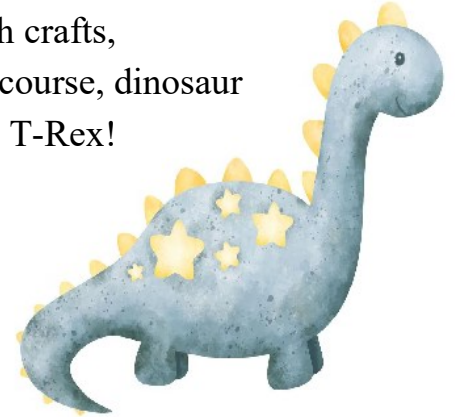


# Tallmadge Christian Preschool
