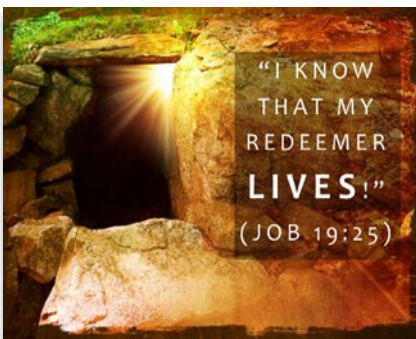

I Know That My Redeemer Lives

Job knows about the darkness of pain and suffering. There he sits on an ash heap — broken, covered in sores, stripped of his children, his wealth, and his health. By any measure, Job has every reason to despair. The giants of grief and loss have chewed him up and left him for dead. And yet, from the depths of his suffering, Job speaks one of the most stunning declarations in all of Scripture:



"I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see him with my own eyes — I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!" (Job 19:25-27)

Not *"I hope."* Not *"I wonder."* Not *"Wouldn't it be nice."* Job says **I know.**

This Easter, these words of faith, "I KNOW" are our launching pad.

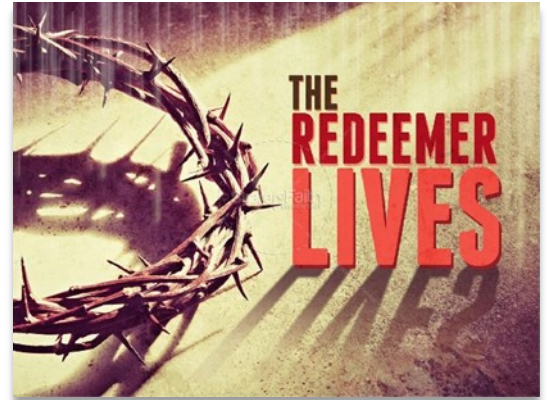

The word **Redeemer** carries enormous weight. In the Old Testament, a redeemer was a close family member — someone with **skin on** — who stepped in to rescue a relative from poverty, slavery, or loss. Whatever went wrong, the redeemer made right. Whatever was broken, the redeemer restored. Whatever was lost, the redeemer recovered.

And that is exactly who Jesus is for you and for me.

He is not a distant, abstract presence. He is not merely a moral example or a comforting memory. He is your Redeemer — personal and particular. As Isaiah declares, "*Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine*" (Isaiah 43:1). And as Paul writes, "*In Christ we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace*" (Ephesians 1:7).

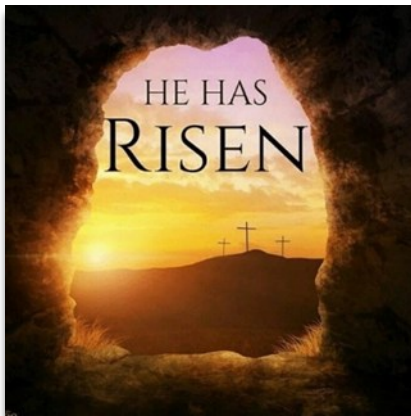


Jesus stepped into the fears of our darkness. He took on skin — skin that felt the Roman whip, skin that bore a crown of thorns, skin that was nailed to a cross. He bore what needed to be borne. He paid what needed to be paid. He did whatever it took to buy us back and set us free.

And then, three days later, the world was rocked: **He lives.**

The women found an empty tomb. John looked in and believed. Mary heard her name spoken by the risen Christ. Thomas saw the scars and fell to his knees: "*My Lord and my God!*" Jesus appeared to more than 500 people on ten different occasions. He was not a sentiment or a ghost — He had skin on, marked with the scars that won our freedom.

"For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed... but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect." (1 Peter 1:18-19)



This Easter Sunday, we wrap up our Lenten sermon series on the Book of Job with this towering passage — what I believe is the Mount Everest of the entire book. Like Job, we are not insulated from life's tragedies. The monsters are real. Our lives can be very long and very dark. But like Job, we are not destroyed by them — because we have a Redeemer who walks with us, a strong hand to guide us and a tender heart to love us.

The old hymn says it best. On Easter morning we'll sing together:

He lives, all glory to His name! He lives, my Jesus, still the same; Oh, the sweet joy this sentence gives: "I know that my Redeemer lives!" (LSB 461)

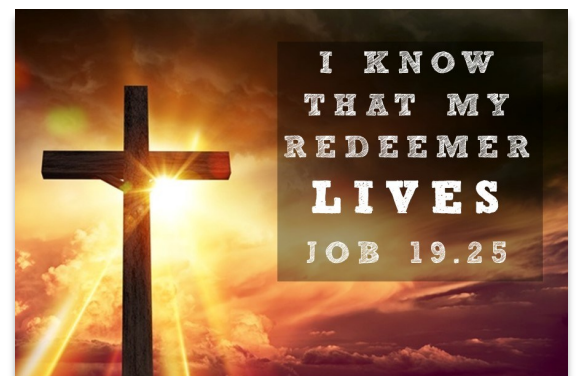
Whatever your long, dark hallway looks like right now — whatever monsters are lurking — you do not walk through it alone. You will **never, ever** walk through it alone.

I look forward to celebrating the resurrection with you on Easter Sunday. Come ready to say with Job, with Thomas, with Mary Magdalene, and with 2,000 years of the Church:

I know that my Redeemer lives!

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Looking forward to seeing you on Monday, April 20 and May 18, at 7:00 pm in Room 12.

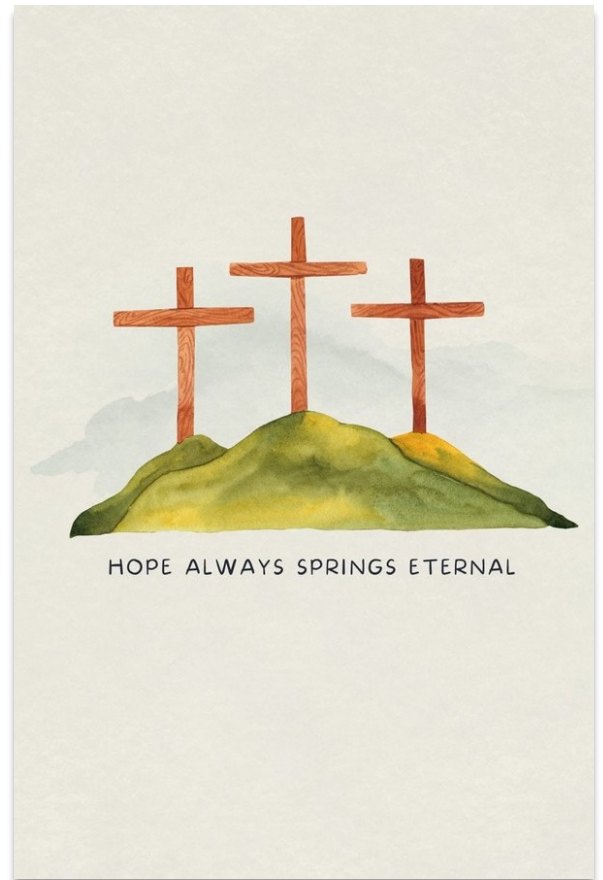
The book for June and July is *The Story of Christianity—Volume 2: The Reformation to the Present Day* by Justo L. Gonzalez.

TLC members and friends of all ages are invited to join the Wise Owls meetings. For the next six months, come share a meal and fellowship with this timeless group of TLC members.

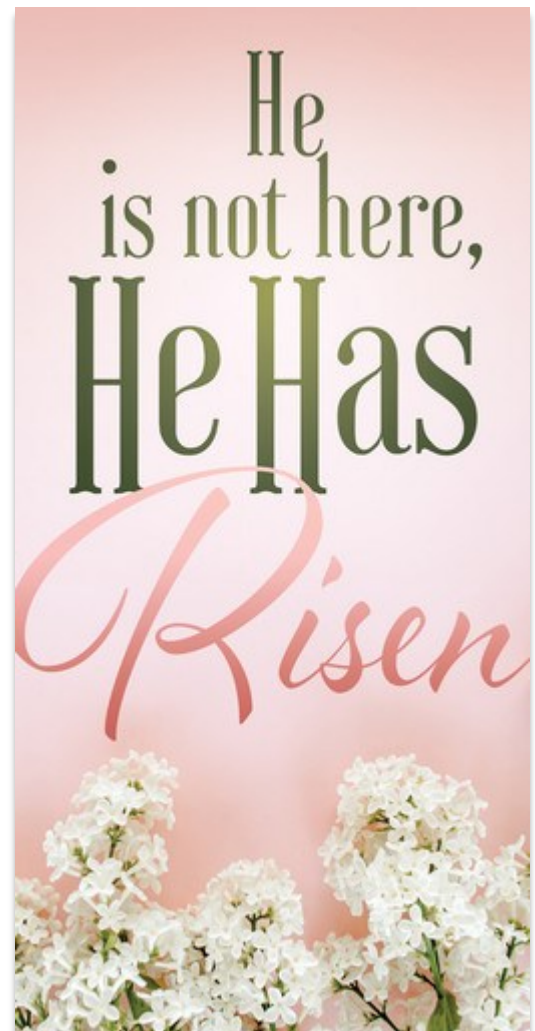

We will begin a new Family Life Marriage study series called "Art of Marriage".

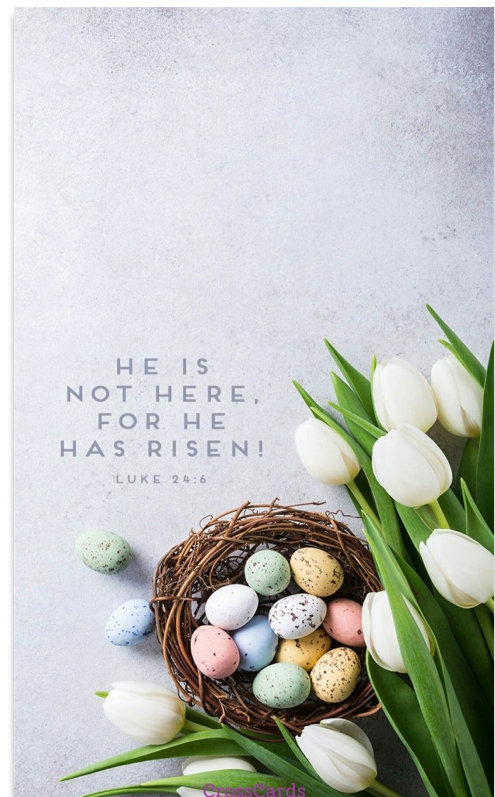
This study is designed to inspire and equip all marriages whether newly married, seasoned, empty nesters or part of a blended family.

Genesis Leader Training

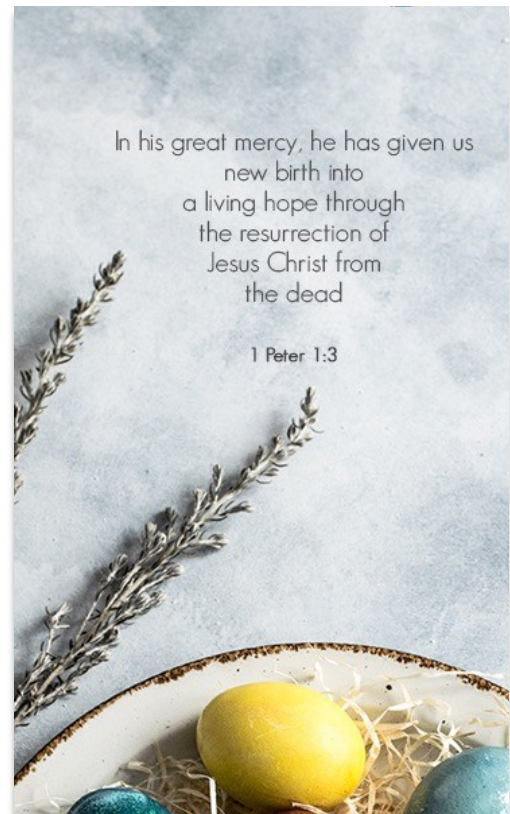
New 9-month Cohorts starting March & May 2026
